Bonefish



Bonefish is a Catch-And-Release fishery

June 2013: FWC Commissioners approved measures to make bonefish a catch-and-release only fishery. This includes the elimination of a tournament exemption permit. This exemption allowed tournament anglers with the proper permit to temporarily possess bonefish for transport to a tournament scale. This change went into effect Sept. 1, 2013. The use of a multiple hook in conjunction

with live or dead natural bait to harvest or attempt to harvest bonefish was also prohibited Sept. 1, 2013.

Verdier av alternativ forvaltning

Bonefish mature at three to four years of age (17-18 inches total length), may live longer than 23 years, and grow to be three feet long and 15 pounds. Bonefish can be caught year-round in the Keys, but peak bonefish season is generally March through October. Not much is known about the biology of bonefish, but spawning occurs from November through May, probably in deep water or offshore.

There are multiple similar-looking species of bonefish that inhabit Florida waters, but the common bonefish (*Albula vulpes*) dominates Florida's recreational fishery. Little is known about the other bonefish species, but many juvenile bonefish caught in Florida have been identified as bigeye bonefish (*Albula garcia*). Bigeye bonefish appear to live in Florida waters as juveniles and leave sometime before adulthood.

Conserving One of Florida's Most Valuable Gamefish

A recent study by scientists at the University of Miami estimated the value of a single bonefish in the Florida Keys to be \$3,500 each year. **That's nearly \$75,000 over the lifespan of the fish!** Most bonefish anglers recognize the value of bonefish as a gamefish in Florida and practice catch and release with the bonefish they catch. Sport fishing and its economic impacts

Sport fishing in Costa Rica has impacts on the local and national economies.

In 2018, information was gathered in seven communities (Tamarindo, Flamingo, El Coco, Herradura, Quepos, Golfito and Puerto Jimenez) about these impacts. Also, a macroeconomic study on the national level was done.

The results on this research revealed an amazing story for the country. Costa Rica receives around **\$500 million per year because of the activity**, more than traditional exports like coffee, which is around \$380 million per year. These \$500 million represents nearly 13% of the total income of tourism per year for the country.

Twenty-five years ago, Costa Rica was known as the sailfish capital of the world.

Sport fishing also contribute to other industries such as transportation (\$200 million per year) and the hospitality business (\$210 million per year), showing that sport fishing activity is key for other important economic activities in the country.

The study also shows how people working in sport fishing have a high quality of life: higher family income, access to infrastructure and better educational opportunities. Sport fishing boat operations contributes in around \$52-74 million to local coastal economies (salaries, maintenance, fuel, provisions and others).

Captains and mates who work directly on boats earn 45% more than the average family income for some areas like Quepos. Key aspects like presence of sport fishing infrastructure in the different communities make better job opportunities, job stability and more income.

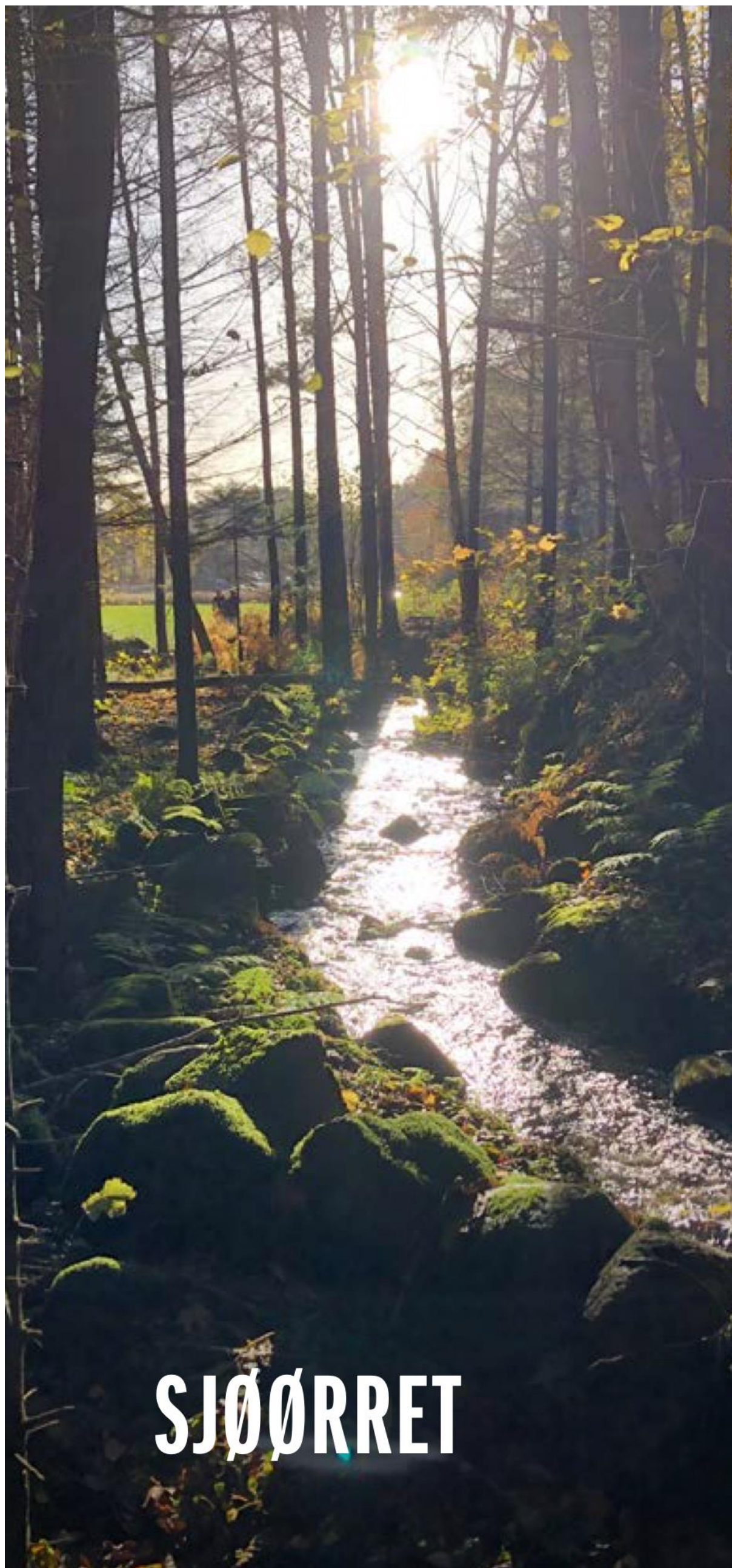

Das Projekt ist eine Zusammenarbeit zwischen dem norwegischen Institut für Meeresforschung, dem Umweltministerium, der Bezirksverwaltung Agder, den Gemeinden Lillesand, Grimstad, Froland, Arendal, Tvedestrand und Risør sowie einer Reihe von Hotels und anderen Unterkünften entlang der Küste. Das Projekt Sjøørret Sørlandet (Meeresforelle Sørlandet) setzt sich für bessere Bestände und eine größere biologische Vielfalt ein.

SEATROUT FISHING ALONG THE COAST OF SOUTHERN NORWAY

The Southern Norwegian coast offers amazing opportunities for recreational fishing – especially those hunting for Seatrout. Growing stock and ever larger fish.

The project is a collaboration between the Institute of Marine Research, Ministry of Climate and Environment, Agder county municipality, the municipalities of Lillesand, Grimstad, Froland, Arendal, Tvedestrand and Risør and various hotels and other overnight accommodations along the coast. The Sjøørret Sørlandet (Southern Norway Seatrout) project is dedicated to increasing stock sizes and improving biodiversity.

In collaboration with various primary and secondary schools, the project members are helping to restore and maintain streams and waterways in order to improve the growing conditions for the fish and contribute to sustainable operations.

But how do you get the most desirable fish species to bite? Where are the best places to fish in the summer? And in the winter? What kind of fishing lure should you use and what kind of fly do salmon trout like best at dusk?
